1 - Start on any note on the Keyboard.

2 - Call that note # 1 in your Musical Scale.

3 - Move upward the number of steps the Formula calls for...

4 - Continue until you reach # 8

-- HINT: it should have the same letter name as your #1 key.

(Remember: Each key, black or white, counts as one-half step. Sometimes you will skip from a black to a white key or vice-versa.)
